EDUCATION UPDATE Scholarship Criteria

The applicant can propose attendance at workshops or schools of art, or to work with masters, mentors or elders in particular media. Within a period of one year, the artist must complete a project that demonstrates the development of skills and techniques learned as a result of the scholarship. This work will be displayed at the Vancouver International Airport.

YVRAF Scholarships are available to individuals meeting the following criteria:

- Aboriginal residing in British Columbia.
- Youth 25 years of age or younger.
- Emerging artists who can demonstrate potential in visual arts, in the Northwest Coast style.
- Emerging artists who can create projects that are suitable for display in public buildings.

Emily Carr University and the Northwest Community College establish their own eligibility criteria, which generally matches criteria for the YVRAF Scholarship above, except the educational institutions may award to artists over 25 years of age.

Scholarship Amount : Annual scholarship up to \$5000 are awarded for eligible activities.

We also viewed the plaster face masks they created with Barbara Stevens, as a representation of the healing they engaged in on their trip. The second part of the evening was acknowledging Gladys Vandal and the participants of the cedar weaving courses she teaches. Also acknowledged were Gladys' assistants-Al Vandal who prepares the cedar for the weaving classes, Isabel Brillon who assists in the cedar weaving classes and also has worked one-on-one with people during office hours throughout the years, and Cohen Isberg, the newest assistant Gladys has taught. The latest group of weavers danced their cedar hats as Jenny Cross sang Haida songs. There were moving speeches made and knowledge shared. There was a beautiful spread of appetizers and Christmas goodies and lots of door prizes all wrapped in Christmas wrap. It was a fun evening enjoyed by all.

We would like to acknowledge the passing of our Support Worker, Isabel Brillon's husband, Wylie Brillon. We are grateful for the help we received from Wylie over the years with our programming. Whether it was building a stand to display our poster board or figuring out how to make hat molds for our cedar weaving programs, Wylie was always willing to help. 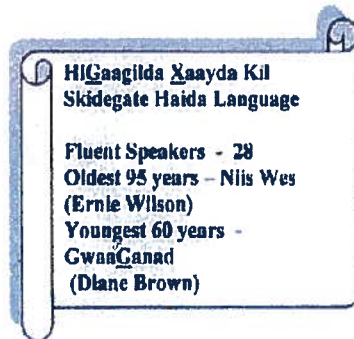

UPDATES

Skidegate Band lot POLICIES:

- 1) Each person is allowed 1 (one) residential lot in Skidegate.
- 2) Band Members receiving a housing grant must sign their lot (on reserve) over to the Band Council or family member that doesn't currently own a lot, if they are going to build at another location on reserve.
- 3) Recipients of housing grants are to utilize serviced lots only.
- 4) ***No serviced lots are to be allocated unless the applicant has received a housing grant or has provided proof of funds in place to build their house to completion.***
- 5) Housing grant recipients requesting serviced lots will be allowed to put their name in pencil on the lot until the Skidegate Band Council gives approval in the form of a motion.
- 6) Effective with the next constructed subdivision, lot sizes are to be 90' wide by 100' long.
- 7) The house is to be situated squarely on the lot and in line with other lots/houses –see "Attachment 1: Sitting Requirements".
- 8) Before construction begins, ***homeowners must consult Ed Hans or Phil Gladstone regarding water and sewer lines*** to ensure clearance of the lines and lot boundaries. This will ensure that the house is built within the person's lot boundaries and is situated in an orderly manner.
- 9) ** Policy on Fire Protection and access needed.
- 10) A lot with no house on it cannot be willed or sold to anyone.
- 11) No un-serviced lots will be allocated in Skidegate.
- 12) For un-serviced lots that have already been allocated before adoption of these Lot Policies, the following applies:
 - a) People building on undeveloped land are responsible for:
 - i) Legal survey; ii) Power; service, connection and poles; iii) Roads; iv) Water; and
 - v) Clearing and grubbing.
 - b) Band Members who are the recipients of a housing grant and building on an un-serviced lot cannot use their housing grant for site preparation or water and sewer services.
 - c) If your lot is un-surveyed, band member must obtain a letter from the Skidegate Band Council stating the size of the lot and within 2 years, the homeowner must have their lot surveyed at their own cost.

This has been advertised for Skidegate Band Members not sure of any lot questions that may arise. The Housing Committee, Housing Coordinator & Skidegate Band Council will address any issues regarding lots in question. The Housing Department has the proper measurements for all lots in the Skidegate Reserve. Members should be contact the Skidegate Band and requesting review of their plan to have anything outside of their lot.
